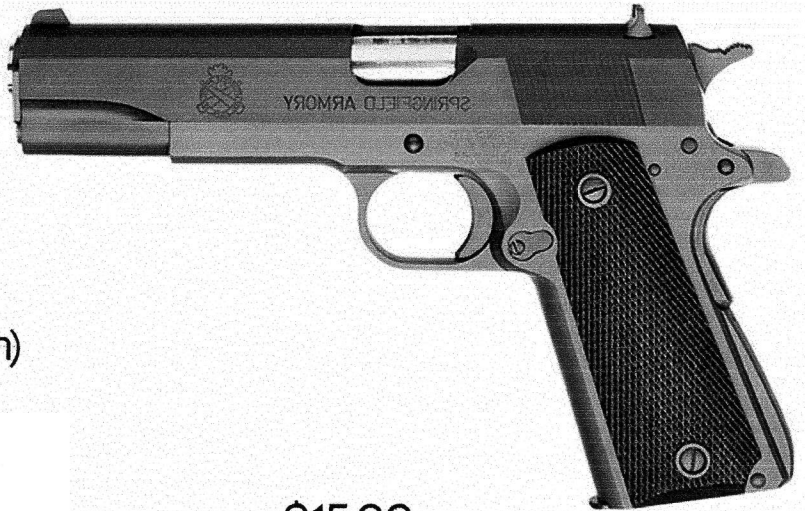

Range Restrictions:

The following are NOT PERMITTED on any range:

- alcohol
- fully automatic weapons
- trigger activators
- armor-piercing/incendiary/tracer bullets
- .50 caliber BMG firearms or ammo
- pistol-grip long guns without a shoulder stock

directions to Range:

Take 101S to 85S to Saratoga Exit. Turn right on Saratoga Ave. for about 2.0 miles (stay in right lane) to TRAFFIC SIGNAL in Saratoga Village. From TRAFFIC SIGNAL in Saratoga Village (at Fire Station & 76 Station drive straight ahead on Hwy 9 (Saratoga Ave. changes to Hwy 9) for about 7.4 miles through town and up the winding road to the top of the hill at the 4-Way Stop signs. This is Hwy 35 or Skyline Blvd. Turn left, drive about 1.5 miles to the Range entrance on the right. (There is a white sign, on the right, about 450 feet before the entrance to driveway.) Start slowing down at this point, turn right down the hill and through the gate to the Range Office.

SAFETY REQUIREMENTS

AT ALL TIMES:

1. Observe the 3 MPH Speed Limit.
2. Wear eye and ear protection.
3. Comply with Range Safety Officer direction promptly.
4. Keep pets secure inside your vehicle.
5. Pick up your own brass and trash before leaving a range.
6. Report any injuries to a Range Safety Officer immediately.

DURING SHOOTING SESSIONS:

7. Keep muzzles pointed downrange.
8. Allow a minimum of two (2) seconds between shots on all ranges.
9. Restrict rapid firing to .22 caliber firearms on the 40 yard tin can range.
10. Only shoot at your own targets.
11. Closely supervise those in your party under 18 years old. You cannot shoot while your underage shooter is handling a firearm.
12. Transport **EMPTY** firearms between stations, or your vehicle and a range, with actions open and muzzles pointed up.

DURING CEASE FIRES:

13. Listen to all tower announcements.
14. Make your firearm safe:
 Open and clear all actions.
 Remove magazines.
 Lay unloaded firearms on bench with muzzles pointed downrange.
15. Collect targets and stapler or tacks from your shooting station.
16. Stand behind the white safety line and listen to announcements.
17. Do not approach or stop at your shooting station.
18. Do not handle or transport any firearms.
19. Post paper targets below the white chalk line and centered on the black paper provided.
20. Limit Tin Can Range targets to tin, aluminum, or plastic containers no larger than one (1) gallon in size, weighted with water only.

PROHIBITED

ALCOHOL, FULLY AUTOMATIC FIREARMS, ARMOR-PIERCING BULLETS, INCENDIARY BULLETS, TRACER BULLETS, TRIGGER ACTIVATORS, 50 CALIBER BMG AMMO, EXPLODING TARGETS, LONG GUNS WITHOUT A FIXED OR EXTENDED FOLDING STOCK, AND ANY FIREARM THAT DOES NOT COMPLY WITH STATE OR FEDERAL LAWS. NO HOLSTERS, FAST DRAW OR HIP SHOOTING ON ANY RANGE.

 (WITH TWO 25 YARD RIFLE SIGHT-IN LANES)

SHOTGUN PATTERNING

100 YARD RIFLE RANGE
 (REVOLVERS AND SEMI-AUTO PISTOLS ON FIRST 6 STATIONS ONLY)

NO RIFLES AND HANDGUNS ON TRAP RANGES

ELECTRIC TRAP RANGE
 (OPEN TO PUBLIC; SIGN UP AND PAY AT OFFICE)

MANUAL TRAP RANGE
 (REVIEW MACHINE OPERATION WITH RANGE SAFETY OFFICER BEFORE SHOOTING)
 BIODEGRADABLE CLAYS ONLY
